DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN BHUJ AND TRANSFER TO RANN OF KUTCH

If your visit coincides with the Rann Utsav (festival season), the desert comes alive with cultural performances, traditional folk music, and dance, adding a festive touch to your experience. DAY 2 : RANN OF KUTCH TO BLACK HILL (KALA DUNGAR), DHOLAVIRA

Start your day with a visit to Kala Dungar (Black Hill), the highest point in Kutch. From here, you'll get panoramic views of the vast white desert below, providing a stunning contrast between the black hills and the white salt plains. It's a perfect spot for photography and for appreciating the sheer beauty of the Kutch region. Next, proceed to Dholavira, one of the most prominent archaeological sites of the Indus Valley Civilization. Dholavira offers a fascinating glimpse into the life of the Harappan people, with its well-preserved ruins, intricate drainage systems, and ancient reservoirs. The site is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and exploring its vast remains provides an unforgettable historical experience. After exploring Dholavira, In the evening, enjoy another unforgettable sunset at the Rann, followed by cultural programs that showcase the vibrant traditions of Kutch. Overnight stay in Kutch.



DAY 3 : MATA NO MADH, MANDVI, AND BHUJ

Begin your day with a visit to Mata no Madh, an ancient temple dedicated to Maa Ashapura, where you can experience the spiritual essence of Kutch. From there, head to Mandvi and explore the majestic Vijay Vilas Palace, a beautiful blend of Rajput and colonial architecture.

Afterward, relax at Mandvi Beach, known for its serene atmosphere and golden sands. Enjoy a leisurely stroll, a camel ride, or simply unwind by the sea.

By evening, arrive in Bhuj and check in to your hotel. Spend the rest of the evening exploring Bhuj's vibrant streets by your own or enjoying a quiet dinner. End the day with a restful night stay, preparing for the adventures ahead.



DAY 4 : BHUJ – LOCAL SIGHTSEEING, SHOPPING, AND DEPARTURE
