Travel Itinerary

DAY 01

Dehradun to Barsu

We begin our journey from Dehradun to Barsu early in the morning. The drive offers a visually captivating experience, with changing mountain landscapes and the vibrant colors of the holy Bhagirathi River as we delve deeper into the valley. Our drive concludes in the serene village of Barsu, the base camp for the Dayara Bugyal trek. Known for its tranquility, Barsu is a popular stop for trekkers and is home to a local temple dedicated to Nag Devta, reflecting the villagers' devotion. The day wraps up with a comforting dinner and a peaceful overnight stay in a homestay.

The trek begins early in the morning after breakfast. As we move forward from Barsu on the well-marked trail, the village fades behind us and we enter a forested path. The trail meanders through oak and rhododendron woods, eventually leading to a charming meadow. Here, we find the picturesque Barnala Tal, a natural highaltitude lake, and the sacred Nag Devta Temple situated at one corner of the lake. The day concludes with setting up our tents for a comfortable overnight stay.

DAY 03

The trek begins in the morning as we follow the forest trail. As we ascend and leave the forest behind, we encounter shepherd huts known locally as Chani. Passing these huts, we are welcomed by the expansive meadow of Dayara Bugyal, framed by the snow-capped peaks of the Himalayas. This lush 28-square-kilometer alpine meadow is the source of several streams and rivers. From here, we can see majestic Himalayan peaks such as Srikanth, Gangotri, Draupadi ka Danda, Jaonli, Bandarpunch, and Swargarohini. We take time to soak in the beauty at Dayara Top before trekking back to Barnala Tal, our campsite for the night.

The trek begins early in the morning as we descend from Barnala Tal back to the village of Barsu. Traditionally an agricultural community, Barsu has recently experienced a rise in tourism, leading to the development of several guesthouses and creating new employment opportunities. Locals now also work as guides, cooks, and porters. The day concludes with our drive from Barsu to Dehra Dun, enriched by the memories of the stunning Dayara Bugyal.
